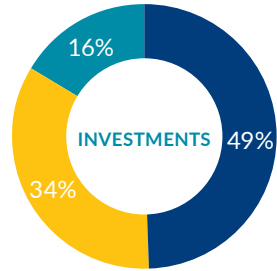


CREATIVE SCHOOLS FUND IMPACT REPORT | 2013-2024

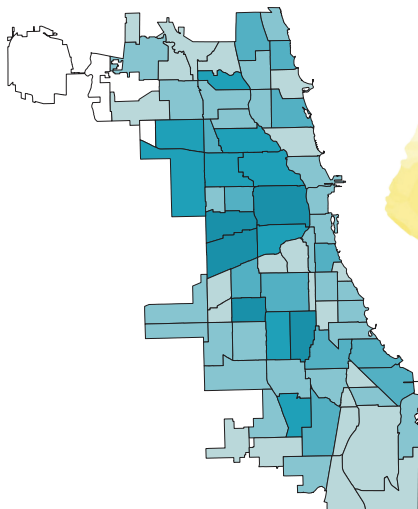
¹ The two community areas that have not been awarded CSF competitive grants historically are O'Hare and Montclare. These community areas have had only one school in recent years.

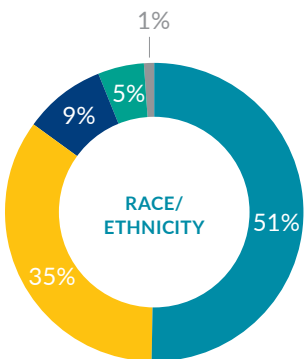

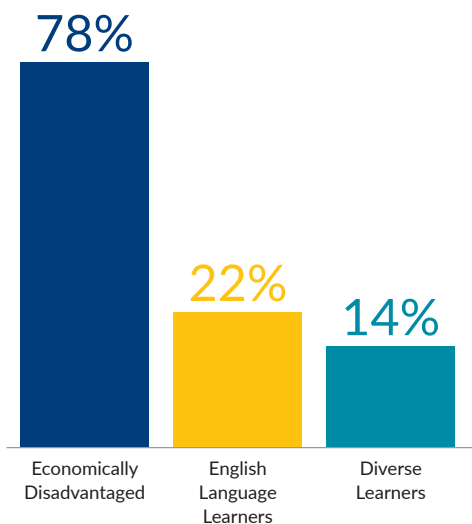
